2. Approval of Agenda

3. Approval of Minutes

4. Reports *Refer to Appendix 1

a) Principal's Report:

-Today UHE students and staff participated in the Great BC Shakeout. Oct. 25th UHE students and staff will practice 'hold and secure' and 'lockdown'. Reviewed the Burnaby School District Emergency Response Guidelines (refer to Principals' Report in Appendix 1 for details). -Reviewed the new Burnaby School District process for completion of Student Consent forms. Only 60% of students have submitted completed forms. Request made for UHE families to complete consent forms (refer to Principals' Report in Appendix 1 for more information).

b) Chair's Report:

-Reminder to Principal Harding to submit receipt for movie licensing purchase to PAC for reimbursement. PAC plans to use movie license in the future to host family movie nights.

-Feedback from families about the new hot lunch vendor Foodie Kids has been positive.

5. New Business

a) Fundraising Ideas:

-Samosas: Discussion postponed

-Lanyards: Exec received referral for a local business that can make mask lanyards with breakaway clip and personalized straps for a PAC fundraiser. PAC expressed interest in the fundraiser idea. Julia will follow-up with the business owner to get more information. Discussed option to sell lanyards with 'UHE' on strap with UHE Spirit Wear in Nov. as a fundraiser. -Bottle Drive: Discussion postponed

-Chocolate Sales: Compared options of Purdy's Chocolates fundraiser and Truffle Pig Chocolate fundraiser. Purdy's has been a popular fundraiser in the past and has more options for holiday gifts. Truffle Pig Chocolate is ethically sourced and headquarters is local. It was decided that PAC will run Purdy's Chocolates fundraiser before the winter holidays and will consider Truffle Pig Chocolate fundraiser later in the year. (Volunteer Lead: Stephanie) -Family Photo Sessions: Hoang has offered to provide outdoor fall family photo sessions, by donation to the UHE PAC, on SFU campus. Photo sessions appointments on Oct. 23 and 24th are now full.Exec requested parent volunteers to help with the family photo sessions fundraiser this weekend. If photo sessions go well, PAC will consider offering another date for the families on the waitlist if photographer Hoang is agreeable or if another volunteer photographer can be located.

-Cobs Bakery Fundraiser: Discussion postponed

- b) Spirit Wear: Discussed option to make UHE Spirit Wear sales a fundraiser. Decision was made to sell Spirit Wear at cost to increase accessibility to families. Principal Harding and Julia will finalize order options. UHE families will receive order forms in Nov.
- c) Community Clean-Up Event Sun. Nov. 7th at 10am-12pm: Committee is requesting prize donations for prize draws at the event. Clea, Joyce and Jessica volunteered to help the committee setup for the event.
- d) Pumpkin Carving Due to current restrictions on school visitors, pumpkin carving activities will not be held at school this year. Exec will inform Nesters.
- e) Parent Education Exec will research BCTF PAC Workshop offerings for 2021-2022. Exec will refer to last parent survey feedback to prioritize workshop topic selection.
- f) Giving Tuesday (Charitable Donations to UHE PAC): Decision was made to prioritize other fundraising initiatives for PAC.
- g) Charitable Community Donations: Previously donated to the Burnaby Christmas Bureau, Quest Food Exchange, Lookout Housing and Health Society, and Union Gospel Mission (socks/mittens). New ideas included: Willingdon Seniors Centre (recently affected by a COVID-19 outbreak), Dixon Transition Society, and Helping Families in Need Society. Also discussed the possibility of submitting UHE student artwork for the SFU Free Fridge Initiative. Idea of a value added raffle was shared. Discussed option of fundraising kick-off at University Community Association HighStreet Lighting event. Exec will discuss options further and select charities. Updates on PAC Initiatives

Nesters Gift Card Fundraiser Update

- We had a good response from families in September. 16 families bought \$1950 worth of gift cards, 10% of which is being donated to the school.
- There should be more potential in this fundraising if we manage to reach more families. We will keep sending reminder emails every month. We can also hand out the informative pamphlet in the future events that we will organize, such as the community clean-up.

Hot Lunch Update

- We had a few issues with hot lunch in September and early October, mostly related to a mix up in orders. We were able to reimburse families who were impacted.
- Parents are responding well to the expanded options offered by Foodie kids. A reminder that orders are due two weeks in advance.

Garden Committee Update

UHE Outdoor Development Project Update

- We have approval to put in trees. We will look into opportunities to get trees donated in the Spring. We should aim to complete this planting this year, since this is when we got approval.
